FOR GRADS AND UNDERGRADS
STUDYING HOSPITALITY

SUMMARY

This scholarship is open to undergraduate and graduate students currently enrolled as a full-time student studying hospitality management or allied profession.

KEITH ROTH

This scholarship was established in memory of Keith Roth, who while serving on our Chapter's Board, dedicated most of his time to the Association's scholarship endeavors. This scholarship honors his work and the influence he had on students because of his efforts to raise meaningful funds for them.

ELIGIBILITY

Open to full-time college students currently enrolled in an accredited hospitality program (Associates, Bachelors or Masters) in Club Management, Hotel or Restaurant Management and/or allied professions, with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5.

Student must have completed a minimum of one 12 credit semester.

GUIDELINES

All applicants must submit:

- 1) An **online application form**.
- 2) An **essay** outlining career goals, reason for applying, how the scholarship will help them achieve their goals, what skills they gained working in clubs and how their experience will be transferable to employment post-graduation (min. 400 words).
- 3) A **letter of recommendation** from a member of the Metropolitan Chapter.
- 4) Current **resume**.
- 5) A copy of their current **transcript**.

STEPS FOR APPLYING

APPLICATION FORM

Fill out Keith Roth application online at www.metcf.org.

ESSAY/RESUME/TRANSCRIPT

Send one email to md@metcma.org and attach a single PDF that contains in order your essay, resume and transcript.

LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

The manager letter of recommendation should be e-mailed directly from the Met chapter member to md@metcma.org by the deadline.

DEADLINE

All of these items must be complete by Friday, September 30th for consideration.

MISCELLANEOUS

SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Winners will be chosen by the Keith Roth Scholarship Committee and approved by the MCF Board.

Scholarships are not guaranteed upon submission of an application and awards based on availability of funds and vary in amounts.

Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

Previous winners are not eligible.

The scholarship award is made directly to the bursar at the college or university the recipient attends and will be paid for the spring 2023 semester.

Recipients will be announced at the November Annual Meeting.
